From the Pastor...

We are entering into our annual stewardship season for the Presbyterian Church at Woodbury. Our theme, this year is "Back to Basics," and so we want to ask: What do you think of when you see the word - STEWARDSHIP? Many of us think immediately of money. We recall the annual time in our congregation's life when we are asked to make a financial commitment for the coming year. At some level, however, we are aware that stewardship is more than money. Stewardship is how we live out our calling as followers of Christ. Stewardship is what we do after we say that we believe. This year, we will be focusing on the biblical understanding of being good stewards with the gifts that we hold in trust and our relationship with Jesus Christ! We will be centered upon the following themes during October:

GIVE: OCTOBER 5 Focus on the need of the giver to give of their time talents and treasures, not the need of the church to receive: The Bible seldom mentions the need of the temple or the church to receive the resources. Rather, the focus stays on the giver's need to give. Giving is an act of worship that acknowledges our dependence upon God. Generous giving is an act of discipleship.


THREAT: OCTOBER 12 Focus on money's inherent threat: The Bible recognizes that money has the potential to be a huge roadblock in one's relationship with Jesus, who says, "You cannot serve God & wealth" (Matthew 6:24; Luke 16:13). In a land of so much affluence, followers of Jesus need to take this seriously.

<u>OPPORTUNITY: OCTOBER 19</u> Focus on the inherent <u>opportunity</u> to share our time, talents and treasures: Jesus provides us with an incredible promise when he says, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21; Luke 12:34). Our resources have the ability to lead the heart. When we give generously to Christ's mission, we embrace Jesus' promise that our hearts will be led to him as well.

PROMISE: OCTOBER 26 Commitment Sunday – presentation of pledge cards in 10:00 am worship. During the service, we will make our promise to God, and "Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's." This promise will allow the continued ministry of the Presbyterian Church at Woodbury, but also remind us of our relationship with God.
